

Code of Conduct

Grounds for Removal

The following actions constitute grounds for removal from the Bay Area Discovery Museum due to violations of the Code of Conduct:

- Violation(s) of the Code of Conduct
- Leaving children (under 18 years old) unattended at the museum.
- Failure to maintain control of service animals, resulting in potential harm or disruption.
- Refusal to comply with directions from museum staff.
- Unauthorized entry into controlled or restricted areas.
- Intentional blocking of museum entrances, ramps, steps, exhibit spaces, pedestrian pathways, admission lines, or event activities, including valet services.
- Failure to wear appropriate clothing covering the upper and lower body, including footwear. Children over age 2 must be fully clothed.
- Disruptive photography, filming, or recording of staff or visitors that interferes with the safe and orderly use of the museum or staff operations.
- Intentional noise disruption or failure to maintain electronic devices, such as phones or gaming devices, at a reasonable volume.
- Damage to or theft of museum property or store merchandise, including vandalism such as permanent markings on facilities.
- Being under the influence of controlled substances without a valid prescription while on museum premises.
- Smoking or vaping any substance indoors, outdoors, or within 20 feet of museum entrances, exits, or operable windows.
- Engaging in petition signature gathering or leafletting activities in unauthorized areas of the museum. (solicitation)
- Creating a physically offensive condition, such as disturbing odors or infested clothing or belongings.

Visitors or members can be suspended from visiting the Bay Area Discovery Museum if repeated offenses occur. Length of suspension is determined by our on-site safety and leadership team.
