3-Day Teacher Professional Development on
Cross-Curricular Connections through Playful Projects

WHEN: Tuesday, June 16 - Thursday, June 18

TIME: 9AM - 4PM

WHO: PreK – 2nd Grade Educators

WHAT: Educators will participate in a 3-day workshop on using project-based playful learning strategies for cross-curricular connections in the classroom led by the Bay Area Discovery Museum Education Team. The hands-on workshop will include the research behind the importance and value of play-based learning, observation, reflection, and actionable planning time. Educators will engage in hands-on activities, reflect on their own teaching strategies, collaborate and learn from and with colleagues, and create activity plans to take back to their classrooms.

During the 3-day session, educators will:

-  Explore the science behind how play supports the developing brain and is key for academic and socio-emotional skills.
-  Gain more confidence in incorporating open-ended, play-based projects that spark learning across subjects.
-  Collaborate with fellow educators and create practical, playful projects to develop cross curricular connections in their classroom.
